There are two funding entities:

- 1. The Rotary Club of Naperville Charities
- 2. Naperville Rotary Charities (NRC)

Both Charities only fund humanitarian programs.

The 2018 Community Service Objective will be to focus funding on the following:

Basic Humanitarian Needs (defined later in this application)

Funding Criteria (please review carefully):

- Applicants must be a 501(c)3 organization. (Supporting documentation required)
- No distributions are made to individuals, political groups or political activities, or to Rotarians or their families.
- No awards are made to foundations or other endowment funds which retain the monies.
- Awards are made for the current Rotary year only. There are no multi-year commitments.
 Annual requests are required. Maximum annual award is \$10,000.00.
- Focus is on organizations with low fundraising and administrative expenses.
- Distributions must benefit Naperville and surrounding area.
- Rotary funds must have a measurable impact on the organization and the community it serves.
- Completed applications must be received by March 5, 2018.
- Evidence of 501(c)3 status and Page 1 of IRS Form 990 are required.
- Verbal requests will not be accepted.

Grant Funding Program Criteria

"Basic Humanitarian Needs" are essentials that are needed in order to prevent the threat to the health, safety, security, or well being of a community or other large group of people. In other words, to provide essentials to people in need. These include the simplest of needs, such as, food, clothing, shelter, physical and mental health, education, and sanitation. Any need that sends a person from poverty to a crisis situation is considered a basic humanitarian need.

The grant award selection process weighs the above criteria to a qualifying organization's proposed project that are closest to meeting this criteria factoring the allocation of awarded funds available that can achieve the goals of the proposed project.

It is highly recommended that an explanation be included that addresses alternatives if there can be reduced funding for a proposed project and the minimum amount required to still provide for the proposed project to be move forward.
